RHINOPLASTY Dr. Kirkpatrick Preoperative Instructions

- 1. Avoid taking **ASPIRIN** or **ASPIRIN-CONTAINING** products (Advil, Motrin, Aleve, Excedrin, Etc) for at least two weeks before surgery. Aspirin interferes with coagulation and can cause excessive bleeding and bruising.
- 2. DO NOT EAT or DRINK anything after midnight on the night before surgery or 8 hours prior to arrival.
- 3. Continue with your regular skin care routine as instructed prior to the procedure. DO NOT WEAR ANY MAKEUP or MOISTURIZER on the day of procedure.
- 4. Avoid drinking alcohol for 48 hours before surgery. Alcohol interferes with some of the medications that are given during surgery.
- 5. Please let us know of any herbal/homeopathic/diet pills that you might be taking as it may interfere with anesthesia. Please stop all of these at least one month prior to surgery. This includes Omega 3 Fish oil supplements and high dose Vitamin E. You may continue one week after surgery.
- 6. Avoid sun-exposure/tanning of the operative areas for at least one month prior to surgery.
- 7. If you smoke, it is important that YOU STOP SMOKING/using nicotine, one month prior to surgery. Smoking has detrimental effects on tissue viability and healing and may complicate your overall recovery period.
- 8. Wear loose-fitting clothes and a button up shirt on the day of surgery.
- 9. One finger on the right hand needs to be nail polish free.
- 10. Please make arrangements for someone to accompany you home after the surgery and someone to stay with you during the first 24 hours after you return home. If this is a problem, our office can help you with arranging assistance. Please supply the name and phone number of the person who will take you home upon arrival on the day of surgery.
- 11. Please remove all jewelry including body piercings, contact lenses, dental prosthetics etc. On the day of surgery leave all valuables at home.
- 12. Bring all medications prescribed by Dr. Kirkpatrick with you on the day of surgery.
- 13. Be sure to have Metamucil or another source of fiber on hand following your procedure.
- 14. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS: All patients should stop taking birth control pills 2 weeks prior to surgery. Birth control pills may increase the risk of blood clots.
